Avian Influenza ADVICE

Avian influenza has been detected in seabirds

This virus is not transmissible to humans but it can affect domestic birds.

It thus represents a high risk to poultry farming.

Please do not feed any wild birds. The public should avoid contact with birds including their feathers and waste

- do not pick up or touch sick, dying or dead wild birds.
- avoid contact with surfaces contaminated with bird faeces.
- do not touch or get in contact with any domestic birds.

When back from your trip please don't forget to wash the soles of your shoes with detergent (dish liquid) and after disinfect them with bleach.
